THE BIG 8 PUB CRAWL

The Bank on College Green
Historic building, gastro-pub
This beautifully-preserved Victorian banking hall was built by the Belfast Bank in 1895. MOMENT will be hosting drinks on the mezzanine level overlooking the main bar between 8-10pm.

The Market Bar
Contemporary, tapas food
Located in an old market hall on Fade Street. Extensive tapas menu until 9:30pm. iQ Content will be hosting drinks between 7:30-10:30pm.

The Mercantile
Spacious bar over 3 levels, music venue, pub grub.
Live contemporary jazz music from 9pm (free).

Pygmalion
Contemporary bar, late club, dj music
Located in the cellars of the Powerscourt Townhouse Centre one of the finest Georgian houses of Dublin.

Oliver St John Gogartys
Traditional bar, music, pub grub, late night
Named after the famous Irish poet, playwright and surgeon, Oliver St John Gogarty, and located in the heart of Temple Bar. Live trad music on the first floor.

The Purty Kitchen
Gastro bar food, live music
Classic rock covers from 9:30pm.

The Porterhouse
Brewery pub, specialist beers, pub grub
Try out some hand-crafted stouts, ales and porters. Make sure to check before you buy - some brews are very strong!

Thomas Read
Contemporary bar
Lively young crowd, bar is split into trendy Thomas Reads at the front and older pub The Oak at the back.

Decorated with stylish Asian décor, elaborate chandeliers, exotic artwork, funky mosaics, lush red velvet curtains and walls ordained with blues roses.

39. Trinity College Dublin

40. Bank of Ireland College Green
This building formerly housed Ireland's parliament.

41. Powerscourt Townhouse Centre

42. Irish Film Institute
Art-house cinema, cafe & bookshop

43. Meeting House Square
Dublin's outdoor indoor space. Adjacent is the Gallery of Photography & the National Photographic Archive.

44. Olympia Theatre

45. Dublin Castle
In continuous occupation since its establishment in 1204 AD, Dublin Castle has played a prominent role in Ireland's history.

46. City Hall
City Hall is an outstanding example of the Georgian architecture for which Dublin is world-renowned.

47. Project Arts Centre

48. Isolde's Tower
Buried in an apartment block basement is the remains of Dublin's medieval city walls & the tower of Isolde who, according to the legend, was the Irish princess who was supposed to wed England's King Mark but fell in love with the knight Tristan.

49. Smock Alley Theatre

50. Wood Quay
The site of the Viking settlement of Dublin.

51. The Contemporary Music Centre

52. Fishamble Street
Handel's Messiah was first performed here on April 13 1742.

53. Christchurch Cathedral
The earliest manuscript dates Christ Church Cathedral to its present location around 1030. The crypt is the oldest surviving structure in Dublin and is one of the largest medieval crypts in Europe, extending the length of the cathedral.

54. St Werburgh's Church
The old church of St. Werburgh, originally built in 1178, was destroyed by fire twice, and rebuilt in a very handsome style in 1759.
